The Mälama Mobile is a "first contact" homeless outreach that provides a modified center-based preschool for families living at Leeward beach parks. ALL families with children ages birth to five are welcomed. Families receive canned and dried goods and social services with partners from shelters and agencies. We have worked with Queen Lili'uokalani Trust, Kamehameha Schools, U.S Veterans Inc., various churches (City of Joy, Nānākuli Baptist, New Hope, OlaNui!) and schools (Kamaile Academy, Mä'ili Elementary & Barber's Point Elementary).
